

Strong and weak current can be connected to the same cable tray



Overview

The national standard GB50303 clearly stipulates: It is strictly forbidden to lay strong and weak power cables in the same pipe, the parallel spacing must be $\geq 300\text{mm}$, and the angle should be $\geq 60^\circ$ when crossing to reduce coupling interference.
